Below is a list of things **ALL SENIORS** should know.

1. **Credits** – Are you enrolled in all the classes/credits required to graduate?  
Regular Day \* Credit Recovery \* Algebra I \* Fine Art or Foreign Language
2. **SAT's**: If you are planning on applying to a 4-year college or university, you must take the SAT. All major colleges and universities (not community colleges) require you to take the SAT Reasoning Test. If you are applying to a University of California (UC) campus, you **may** also need to take the SAT Subject Tests (2 tests in different subject areas) if you are applying for a competitive major. 3. **College Applications**: California State University system will begin accepting applications October 1, 2020 through November 30, 2020. The University of California (UC) system will begin accepting applications November 1 through November 30, 2020.

4. **ASVAB**: Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery – If you plan to enlist in the military, these scores are used to determine if you are qualified and to assign you to an appropriate job in the military. Test date & time TBD. No fee required.

5. **Community Colleges vs. Trade/Technical Schools**: Many junior colleges offer specialized trade and technical programs for a fraction of the costs of a trade/technical school. If you are planning on pursuing a trade/technical education, see your counselor for how to access the California Community College website to see which campuses may offer your trade/technical program.

Scholarships- Last year the BHS community contributed thousands of dollars to the class of 2020 in the form of local, state, and national scholarships. Our first scholarship bulletin will be published mid-fall. Each time scholarships are added Counseling Office Clerk (scholarship office) will publish and distribute a new bulletin. Counselors, economics teachers, and government teachers post these bulletins in their offices and classrooms and they are also available for viewing on the BHS website.

7. **Letters of Recommendation**: You may need a letter of recommendation from teachers and counselors for college applications, financial aid, and scholarships. Give your teachers and counselors time to prepare and write your letter. Be prepared. You should give these people several days notice of your need for a letter(s). In addition, you should provide them with a resume of some kind so they can write you an accurate letter that reflects your accomplishments.

8. **ENDANGERED SENIOR!!!!!!**: DON'T BECOME ONE!!!

A. Failing a first semester class/credit required to graduate.

B. Enrolled Second Semester Credit Recovery to graduate.

C. Earn a 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter F in a class(es)/credits required to graduate.

D. 4<sup>th</sup> quarter deficiency (below C-) in a class(es)/credit(s) required to graduate.

**COLLEGE ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS AND CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION**  
***\*IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE COUNSELING DEPARTMENT\****

**Minimum College Admission Requirements for Cal State/U.C. (A-G requirements)**

- 2 years of history/social science (including one year of World History; and one year of US History or one-half year of US History and one-half year of American Government/Civics)
- 4 years/8 semesters of college prep English
- 3 years of college prep Math (must include Algebra CP or Algebra 1, Geometry, and Algebra 2)
- 2 years of a lab Science (must include two of the three: Biology, Chemistry, Physics)
- 2 years of the same foreign language
- 1 year of the same fine art such as Art 1 & 2, Drama 1 & 2, Orchestra, Symph Band, Con Choir, Dig Mult Design
- 1 year of college prep electives (usually more English, science, math, social studies, fine arts, or foreign language that was not used in the other requirements)

\*Remember, all grades for college admission requirements must be a C or better. They do not recognize a D or an F in a class.

\*Please check the course description guide for a list of our classes that meet the UC/Cal State entrance requirements. SAT Reasoning Test is required for both Cal State and U.C.; U.C. also may require that students take subject area tests if applying for a competitive major.

**Admission to Community College**

**All students planning to attend a two year college will need to supply the school with state testing scores and a high school transcript. The student should contact the school they are planning to attend to verify documents & scores needed to evaluate for placement. Cerro Coso staff comes to B.H.S. in the spring to review enrollment procedures & help students planning to start there after graduation from Burroughs.**

Students without a high school diploma are eligible to attend a two year college if they are 18 years of age.
